South Sudan International Women's Day Conference

Sunday 11 March: This one-day conference is for South Sudanese women of any ethnicity and background to come together to discuss community-led solutions to shared concerns.

The idea for the conference came from a diverse group of South Sudanese women who expressed the need for an inter-ethnic gathering that would provide space for women to discuss issues that affect them. In a collaborative grant-making process facilitated and

funded by the Department of Premier and Cabinet in Victoria, women said they were keen to talk about ways to support social integration, employment pathways, mental health, positive parenting and healthy relationships.

The RMIT School of Global, Urban and Social Studies has generously agreed to provide the venue for the conference. IofC Australia is auspicing the project and is providing event management training as well as volunteers to support the event and provide child supervision. A South Sudan community celebration will take place the next day, 12 March, at the Collingwood Town Hall.
